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Test Results

Last week, the year 6 children received their SATs scores. 81% of our children achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and maths. Nationally, the figure is 59%. These results mean that our Year 6 children are attaining well above the national average in the three core subjects. It also shows how much progress our children have made throughout their time at West End! The children and staff should be very proud of what they have achieved this year. Our target will now be to sustain these results next year!
