

Our Reading Journey - LFS Summer 1

Phase 2

During the first half of the summer term, your child will continue to work on Phase 2. They will continue to learn new graphemes and use these to begin to read simple CVC words.

C= consonant V= vowel C= consonant

Examples of CVC words that the children will read are: sat, man, dog. They will be encouraged to 'sound out' each grapheme before blending them together to read the word.

Your graphemes and tricky words for this half term:

Week	Grapheme	Common Exception Word
Week 1	ck	no
Week 2	e	
Week 3	u	go
Week 4	f	
Week 5	h	l
Week 6	b	
Week 7	f	the

What can I do?

- Ensure that your child recognises the grapheme (letter) of the week and also recalls the graphemes (letters) from previous weeks. This could be done through the use of flashcards or magnetic letters.
- Using letter cards or magnets, make and ask them to sound out CVC words using the graphemes they have learnt.
- Ensure that you look at your child's home reading book with them every day.

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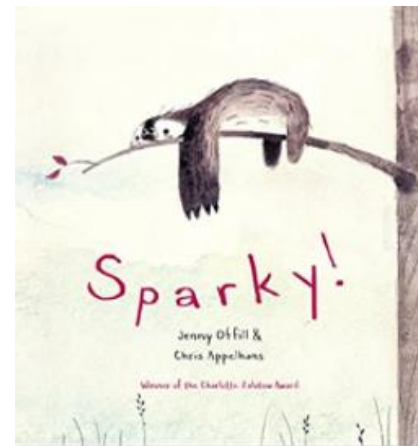
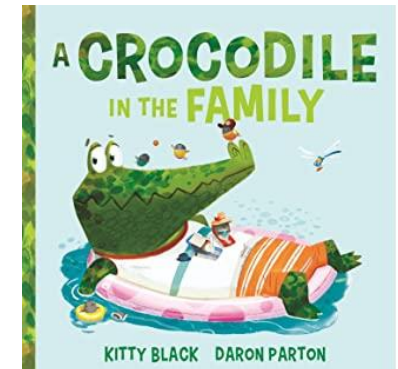
Reading for pleasure
