The recent assemblies have added to the work that the children do on mental health during their relationships and health lessons. We speak to our children regularly about understanding different feelings. We remind them that they must talk to a trusted adult in school immediately if they ever have "big" feelings. "Big" feelings are those that don't go away and stop you from doing normal day-to-day activities.

### **Pupil Questionnaires**

The children have recently completed a questionnaire. The questionnaire asks the children to give their thoughts about school. This week, I have looked at the feedback from the children in Key Stage 2. Every child in Key Stage 2 said that they learn a lot in school and nearly everyone agreed that the school encourages them to be independent and take on responsibilities. Also, all the children agreed that the school encourages them to respect people from other backgrounds and to treat everyone equally. The children also recognised the importance that the school places on making sure they look after their physical and mental health. I am delighted with this feedback.

### **Waterton's Got Talent**

Well done to all the children who recently auditioned for Waterton's Got Talent. I know Mrs Jackson found it hard to choose the children who will represent the school at the show later this year. The children who were successful in their audition will now practise a new routine in preparation for the show. I look forward to watching their progress over the coming weeks.
